Pastor's Perspective

"I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect." Romans 12:1-2

Allow me to take you back to the beginning of April 2020. The pandemic had basically shut down most of the nation. We were under restrictions many of us never thought we would see. There was a great shift toward doing as much as humanly possible to not only protect each other from a virus that we didn't know much about at the time, but to adapt our work, socialization and family life to as much virtually as possible. Some people referred to this as the "new normal."

I'll admit that I really don't like those two words. Frankly, most people I know don't like those two words. Thus, over the next year and a quarter there was the push to do everything possible to return to normal. We continue to hear people on various news outlets speak about getting vaccinated so that we can all return to normal. In many places, we have returned to normal, at least to a way of life prior to the pandemic.

As for those of us who follow Jesus, we should not be in a hurry to return to normal. Normal, as evident in the world in which we live, is marred by envy, gluttony, greed, lust, pride, sloth, and wrath. Certainly, I could have picked other words but the list of the seven deadly sins is such that we all have them in common. "For there is no distinction, since all have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God," (Romans 3:23) These sins are called deadly for they lead to death of the individual, death of relationships, death of communities, and yes, even to an eternal death.

Now, as Lutherans, we know that all sin makes us worthy of God's judgment. While the earthly consequences of our sins vary drastically, the eternal consequence of our sin is the same. We justly deserve God's wrath. The good news is that God does not delight in the death of anyone. Continuing on from Romans 3:24, "(We) are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, whom God put forward as a propitiation (a way of making us right with God) by his blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God's righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over former sins. It was to show his righteousness at the present time, so that he might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus."

In other words, Jesus died so that we would not return to a normal way of life, at least a normal way of life as defined by the world. Rather, having been saved by grace through faith in Jesus, we are transformed to a new way of living. This way of living described in Romans 12 is a way of life that discerns what is the will of God, what is good, acceptable and perfect.

What exactly does that look like? In the current Bible study on the seven deadly sins, we are looking not at the sin itself as much as we look at the way we are called to live.

- Instead of envy, followers of Jesus live out kindness and gratitude.
- Instead of gluttony, followers of Jesus practice self-control or proper stewardship of our time, talent and treasure.
- Instead of greed, followers of Jesus are called to love.
- Instead of lust, followers of Jesus are called to live faithfully to God and to our spouse or for those who are single, practicing self-control which is faithful to God's Word.
- Instead of pride, followers of Jesus are called to humility and goodness.
- Instead of sloth, followers of Jesus are diligent in their life with Christ, practicing the love of neighbor our Lord demonstrated in John 13 when he washed the disciples' feet.
- Instead of wrath, followers of Jesus practice patience.

This is one way of looking at what a transformed life will look like. There is also another way that is closely related, that you'll also find in the 12th chapter of Romans. But alas, that will be part two (or the August edition) of this Pastor's perspective.

DISCRETIONARY FUND

At its June 15 meeting, Council approved a Discretionary Fund for assisting with special needs. Following are the guidelines developed and approved for this fund.

The purpose of this fund is to assist congregation members with important needs. Families or individuals related to an active member of Emanuel may be considered.

The Emanuel Lutheran Church Discretionary Fund will be a separate fund of the congregation.

Each check disbursement requires two signatures. In most circumstances payments will be made directly to the vendor or agency. Documentation is needed from the recipient.

The Pastor will make a determination regarding the need and how much to give toward that need. The Pastor may also consult the Executive Committee of council or the full council as needed.

One thousand dollars from the congregation's budget each year may be used to start the fund and to replenish the fund. Members of the congregation may also make a specific contribution to the fund. This money will be put into the Emanuel Lutheran Church Discretionary Fund.

This fund shall be audited yearly.

All disbursements from the fund shall be held in strict confidence.

The Pastor and his family are not eligible for disbursements from this fund.

These guidelines were adopted by the Congregation Council of Emanuel Lutheran Church on June 15, 2021

GOING BACK TO SCHOOL

At age 68, I am going back to school. I'll be doing it online from my home. Together with about 30 other members of our denomination, I am going back to school to learn how to do two things better: how to follow Jesus daily and how to guide other people in following Jesus daily.

Our crucified and risen Lord, Jesus Christ, ascended to heaven about 2,000 years ago, where He is seated at the right hand of the Father. However, Jesus is also present and active in the world, even though we cannot see Him as He was seen by people from the time He was born until when He ascended into heaven.

When the risen Jesus commissioned His first disciples to go and make more disciples, He made this promise to them and to all who would follow Him in the future: "And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:20b ESV) And so this Jesus whom we follow is Emmanuel—God with us. He is at work every day, continuing "his mission to redeem and restore all people to his Father's kingdom." (*Joining Jesus on His Mission: How to Be an Everyday Missionary*, by Pr. Greg Finke, page 22)

Jesus desires that we follow Him so we can join Him on His mission, assisting Him as the Holy Spirit leads us to do this. In order to follow and assist Jesus, we need to hear Him speaking to us through His Word, and we need to recognize how He is at work around us.

Over the next five months, my classmates and I will be learning together how to hear Jesus better and how to be more aware of the ways in which He is at work around us. Learning how to do these things has a two-fold purpose. It will help us learners in following Jesus daily, and it will help us to guide others in following Jesus daily.

Between now and December, I plan to write an article in The Acolyte every month so I can share with you some of the things my classmates and I are learning. I ask you to keep us and our guides/instructors in your prayers, that together we may learn what our Father in heaven wills for us to learn in the days ahead—all to His glory!
