BELONGING TO GOD'S FAMILY

Our congregation is a blessed community, a local family of faith. And we belong to an even larger family, the family of God. Jesus came into the world to win for all humankind the forgiveness of our sins, so we could be restored to right relationship with God the Father. Jesus won this forgiveness for us and for all people by dying on a cross and rising to new and everlasting life. Every person who is baptized receives this forgiveness, is restored to right relationship with God the Father, and is given the gift of eternal life.

Although God's family already has many, many members, our Father wants it to continue growing. In John 3:16 (NIV), we hear His Son proclaim: "For God so loved the world that He gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life." God loves the world. That means He loves everybody. And He has room in His family for whoever believes in His Son Jesus.

In Mark 16:16 (NIV), Jesus gives this promise: "Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved." As Martin Luther explains, "To be saved, we know, is nothing else than being delivered from sin, death, and the devil and to enter into the kingdom of Christ and live with him forever." (From Luther's Large Catechism: Baptism)

Here in our congregation, we have a mission statement that shows we are intentional about increasing the family of God: "Emanuel Lutheran Church is a community of faith, leading people to Christ." Let us give thanks to God for including us in His family, and for gifting us with the faith and love to lead others into His family through the saving work of Jesus Christ!

Pastor's Perspective

"We always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, when we pray for you, since we heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and of the love that you have for all the saints, because of the hope laid up for you in heaven." Colossians 1:3-5a.

From time to time I have been struck by all the various appreciation days that appear to have multiplied over the course of time. Perhaps it is just that these appreciation days have been around for quite some time, but have found greater awareness thanks to social media. For example, as long as I can remember there has been teacher appreciation week at schools, there is administrative assistants day in April, (or for the politically incorrect, Secretary's Day) fire prevention week in October and the take your child to work day (which if you grew up on a farm, everyday was likely take your child to work day).

Now, if our timing is correct most of you will receive this Pastor's Perspective in the Acolyte on Tractor Sunday. Yes, I did a search to see if there was actually an official Tractor Sunday. While I could not find such an auspicious day, it may well behoove us to acknowledge that National Farmer's Day in the U.S. is October 11th. Somewhat related is Agriculture Day on March 23 which falls during Agriculture week. There is even a Weed appreciation day on March 28th (try to remember that as you're plucking them out of your garden).

At the risk of being somewhat self-serving, October is Pastor appreciation month. We are blessed at Emanuel to have Pastor David and Pastor Brian, who continue to offer their wisdom and God-given gifts. Pastor David has served us well, not only as your interim prior to my arrival, but serves our wider church in his role as Atlantic Mission Region Dean. He will conclude that role at the convocation of our Atlantic Mission Region later this month. Pastor Brian continues to provide leadership to our discipleship seed group and, with me, the building of the discipleship culture here at Emanuel. I am very appreciative of both Pastors as they serve our congregation, especially when I am away for conferences or vacation.

Now a google search will give you specific days to show appreciation for various careers, vocations and yes, even objects. That said, as members of the body of Christ and disciples of our Lord Jesus, let us first and foremost give thanks and appreciation to God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit, one God in three persons, blessed Trinity. God is the giver of all things, having created the heavens, the earth and all that exists (Genesis 1 and 2). Our Lord Jesus Christ has rescued us from sin, death and the devil, reconciling us to God (Romans 5). The Holy Spirit is the Advocate that Jesus promised the disciples on the night of his betrayal and through whom we not only believe, but also is the person who helps us to forgive one another (John 14:15-31, 20:22-23).

Our appreciation for what God has and continues to do in our lives must never be reserved for one day but is communicated daily in prayer and lived out in lives of loving service. Appreciation for God is to be attentive to the word, that is the Bible, and in worship. In fact, one way of giving thanks is to pray the Apostles' or Nicene Creed. Take each phrase, and after each phrase, simply say, "Thank you God" or "Thank you Jesus" or "Thank you Holy Spirit."

While there are certain days of appreciation for individuals, based upon your vocation, let us also support one another by giving thanks for each other. Giving thanks for the people in our lives, for our brothers and sisters in Christ, acknowledges the relationship we have with each other and affirms the God-given value of each individual.

Allow me to conclude with the truth that I am very appreciative of each one of you, my brothers and sisters in Christ at Emanuel. You are called people of God, through whom God is at work. Thank you for your kindness, your generosity in support of our ministry and mission, your willingness to reach out to people in need and most importantly, for your love.
